

GRAND CANYON STATE UNIVERSITY GRANT 2015-2016

Founded in 1949, Grand Canyon University (GCU) is a private Christian university with over 150 academic programs. Our classes involve engaging interaction with classmates and individual attention from instructors who care about student success.

Students attending an Arizona high school that participates in GCU's Participants in Learning, Leading and Serving (PLLS), Canyon Education Participant (CEP) or Alliance Program for Homeschool Achievement (ALPHA) program for Fall 2015, and are accepted to GCU, can receive a \$1,000 GCU grant. This grant is divided into \$500 for the fall semester and \$500 for the spring semester as long as the student maintains the minimum GPA requirements.

Grant recipients must maintain a full-time student status (12 or more credits/semester), remain in good academic standing with a GPA of 3.0 or above.

- Students must complete the GCU admissions application, meeting all admissions requirements and work with an assigned Arizona admissions representative to establish residency.
- Students currently attending a Maricopa Community College must receive their associate's degree before transferring.



This award cannot be combined with the Canyon Christian Consortium Grant. Students who attend or have graduated from a Canyon Christian School is Consortium (CCSC) participant school in Arizona do not qualify for this grant. This grant is subject to the Grand Canyon University CAP policy and cannot exceed your charges. Grand Canyon University CAP Policy: GCU grants are allowed to be combined up to the following limits: Chancellor IB/President's School in Arizona do not qualify for this grant.
