



## **Christian Worldview Requirement for Graduation Participation**

Recently, George Barna, the well-known American researcher, spoke about raising a generation of revolutionary Christian young people. His research has found that for the most part, a child's moral foundation is set by the time he/she is nine years old. His research also found that a child's spiritual foundation is set by the time he/she turns 13. Isn't that what homeschooling does?
