If you have a student who has **not** taken **Christian Worldview at K.E.Y.S.**, but you would like to be involved with the K.E.Y.S. hosted high school graduation ceremony, your student must complete a course using a curriculum that covers the following Christian Worldview criteria:

- Who is God?
- Who is man?
- Who is Jesus?
- Is the Bible infallible?
- Why is there evil and suffering?
- Is there a need for salvation? Why or why not?
- What is the basis for morality and ethics?
- What happens to man at death?

What is a worldview? (understand and know these terms)

- Cover some of the more popular worldviews: Mormonism, Islam, Jehovah Witness, Post Modernism, Secular Humanism, Atheism, New Era of New Age
- Be able to understand worldview terms such as: Monotheism, Deism, Naturalism, Existentialism, Pantheism, and New Consciousness

Students must read: Know What You Believe by Paul E. Little

And at least **one other "approved**" worldview book. You can email Mrs. Rathier or check online in Forms & Documents for the list of books. Some suggested books to help with your course: *The Case of Christ* by Lee Strobel; *Mere Christianity* by C.S. Lewis; *I Don't Have Enough Faith to be an Atheist* by Norman Geisler and Frank Turek

<u>Students must write a 1,500-2,000 word MLA formatted paper</u> (Times New Roman 12 font, 1 inch margins, and double-spaced) that covers the following questions:

• Who or what is God?

- What is the nature of the universe? Is it created? How did it come into being?
- Who is man? What is the nature of mankind?
- Who is Jesus?
- Is the Bible infallible?
- Why is there evil and suffering?
- What is the basis for morality and ethics?
- What happens to man at death?
- What is the meaning of history?
- Is there a need for salvation? What does that mean?
